Worldwide escalating tensions and a depressed global economy called for an increase in WiRED International's services "to bring information technology to the grassroots to help local communities solve local problems."

WIRED met that call with a growing number of COMMUNITY HEALTH INFORMATION CENTERS and other PUBLIC ACCESS INFORMATION CENTERS IN AFRICA, CENTRAL EUROPE and CENTRAL AMERICA. At the same time, we put plans and resources in place for significant expansion during 2003 in additional African and Central European countries.

During 2002, we also saw the release of the first major assessment of WiRED International's work in Kenya. While we knew that WiRED's work was valued and effective, we were surprised by the results. The data verified our critical role in providing students, teachers, family caregivers and community members with HIV/AIDS prevention information. The research also revealed that WiRED International's Community Health Information Centers were the sole or primary source of updated medical information about HIV/AIDS and other health matters for large portions of the professional medical community.

On behalf of WiRED International, I thank each of you who helped bring life-saving information to tens of thousands of individuals during 2002. I look forward to your continued support as WiRED International advances its work to help those in need.


## 2002 ACCOMPLISHMENTS





### Annual budget of \$348,040 (cash and in-kind)




### SOURCES OF EXPENSED REVENUE:
